"Late, Lost & Unprepared" Why Can't My Child Get Organized?

Executive Functioning is an umbrella term for the mental processes that serve a supervisory role in thinking or behavior. Individuals with autism spectrum disorders, attention disorders and learning disabilities have trouble with planning, have weak ability to monitor their own behavior and performance and struggle with situations where they must shift flexibly from one thought or behavior to another. We can help these young people by creating plans that include both short term support for daily success and long term strategies that facilitate the development of executive skills and build greater independence over time.

She is the author of two books on executive functioning: *A Parent's Guide to Late, Lost and Unprepared: A Practical Guide to Helping Children with Executive Functioning* (Woodbine House, 2008) written with co-author Dr. Laurie Dietzel, and *Boosting Executive Skills in the Classroom: A Practical Guide for Educators*, written with Margaret Foster, M.A. (Jossey-Bass, 2013). She is a frequent speaker both in the United States and abroad.

In her work, Dr. Cooper-Kahn brings together science, clinical experience, and an appreciation for the daily demands of those raising and teaching children. Her passion lies at this junction: where psychology informs daily life. For over 25 years, she has specialized in helping children, families and schools manage the full range of developmental challenges affecting children.
